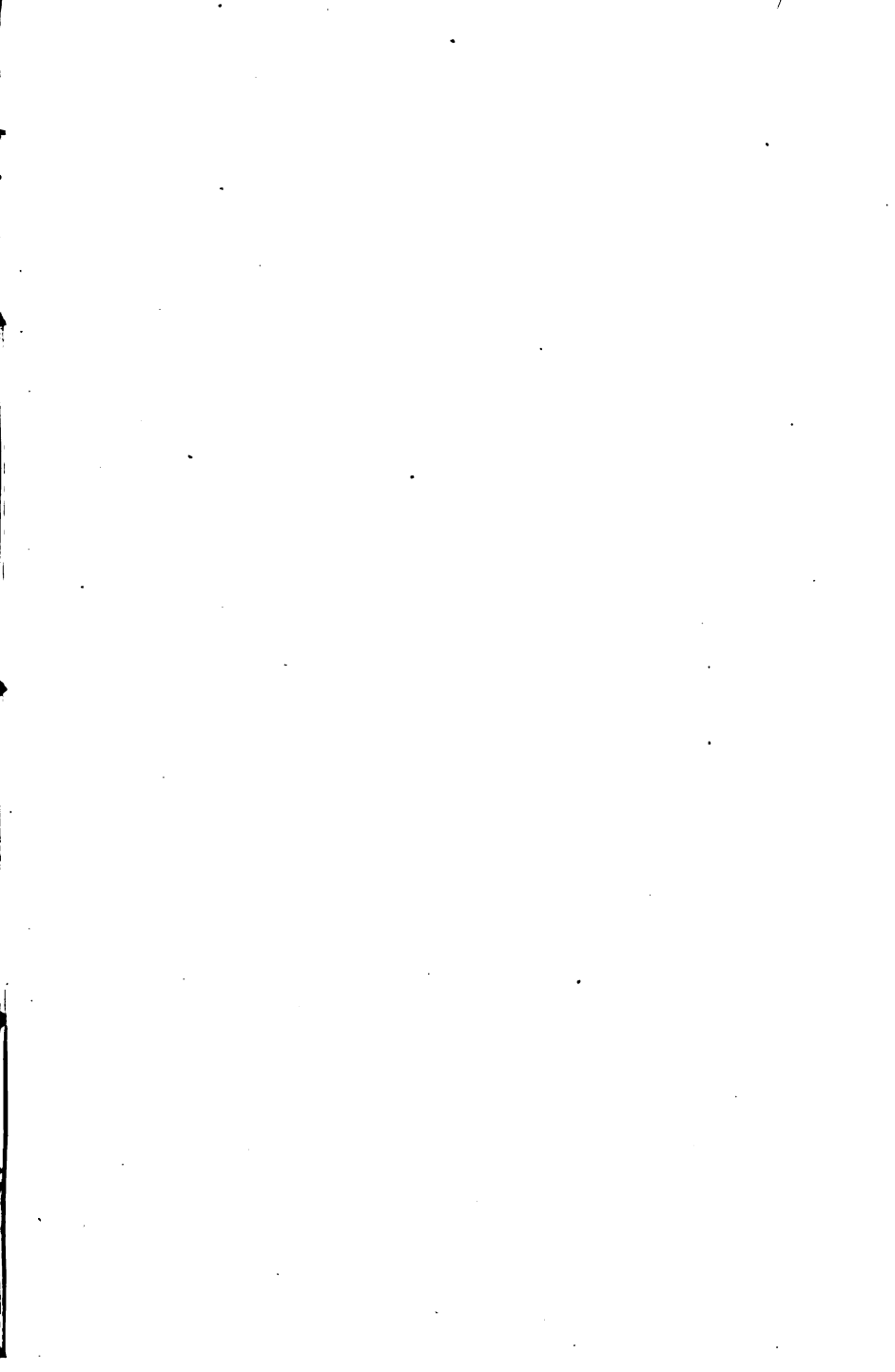
The Liberal canvassers, too, displayed more energy and persistence than their opponents, and so the Liberals scored a notable win.

INTRODUCTION.

THE Compiler of this Work, shortly after his Institution to the Rectory of Saint Matthew, in May 1875, commenced the somewhat laborious task of transcribing the Monumental Inscriptions in his Churchyard.

Being often detained at the Church he began to employ the leisure time in copying the Epitaphs, as circumstances permitted; and when the weather was unfavourable for such employment, verified the inscriptions by reference to the Parish Registers. Thus the work grew, and the gathering up of these fragments of time appears in the present volume: the compilation

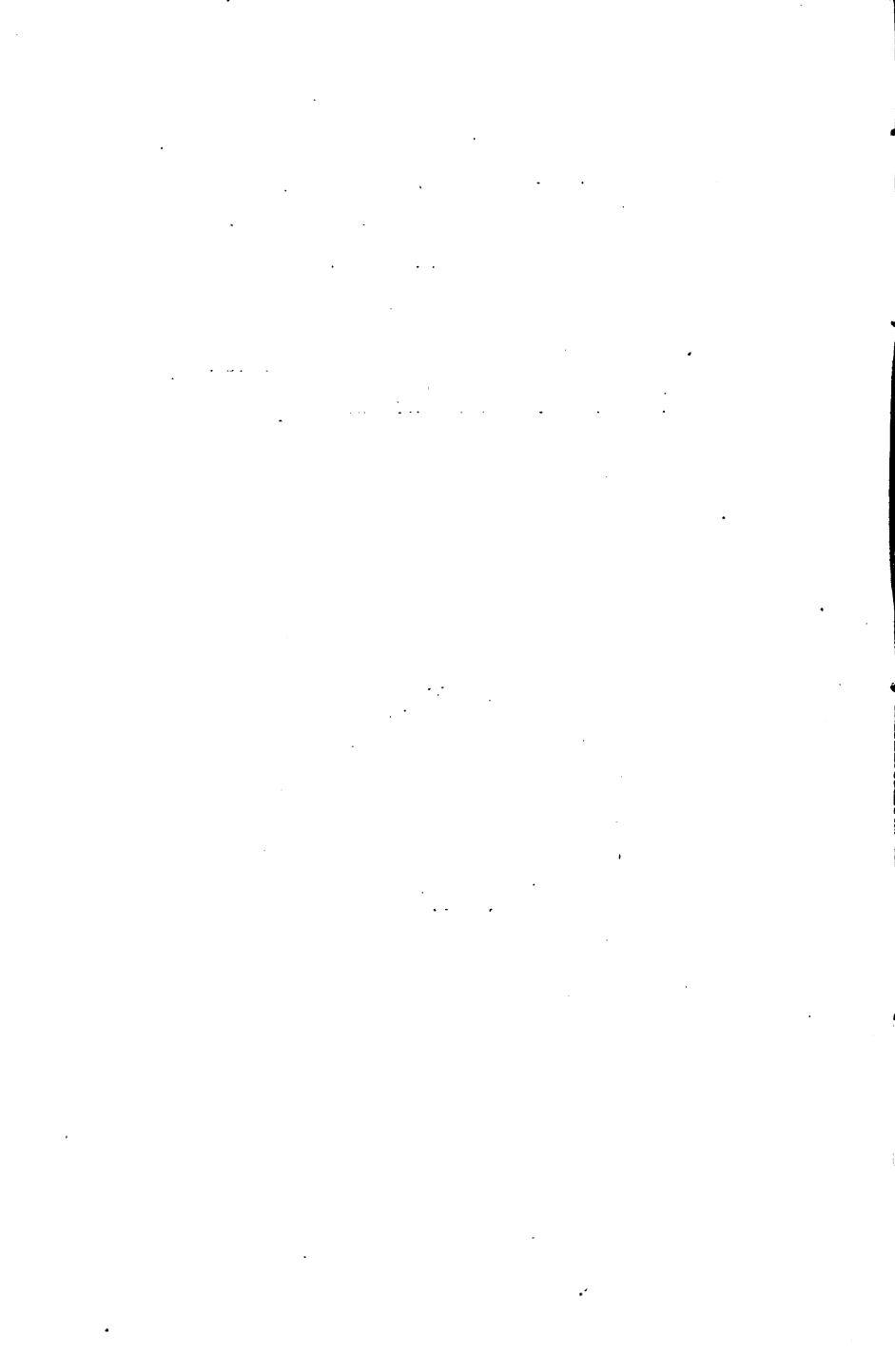
of which has afforded the Author recreation of a literary character, and it is hoped that the completion of the task may interest those who have friends buried in the Churchyard, and prove of value to the Biographer and Historian.

The Monuments have been copied systematically in rows, and the inscriptions carefully transcribed line for line, and word for word, as in the originals.

Expressions and Grammar peculiar to East Anglia appear in the Epitaphs. These give the work a somewhat local interest. But apart from this, Monumental Inscriptions furnish historical facts not to be obtained from other sources, and supply the Genealogist with important information. Parish Registers, unlike Epitaphs, do not enter fully into family history. The former supply only dates of Burial, without any reference to that of the death, frequently omitting the age altogether, both these particulars however, Monumental Inscriptions almost invariably supply.

The Author's Manuscripts have been already transcribed, but for what may have previously appeared, he declines to hold himself responsible, and would add that this is the only edition of the Saint Matthew's Inscriptions corrected by his hand, and issued with his authority.







PREFACE.

THE Churchyard of Saint Matthew's, Ipswich, is considered the largest in Suffolk.

In 1801, during the Rectorship of the Rev. William Layton, upwards of an acre of ground was added to the old churchyard, and consecrated in June, by the Right Reverend Charles Manners Sutton, Bishop of Norwich, afterwards Archbishop of Canterbury.

The churchyard was enclosed by the present iron palisades in 1843.

After the first funeral at the Cemetery, on the Fifth of July 1855, interments in the

churchyard ceased, except in cases where permission was granted by the Home Secretary.

The Monuments are numerous, (more than five hundred in number :) some few stones are quite illegible, whilst many can be read only by a practised eye, to rescue these and others from oblivion, has been the author's object in the Compilation of this volume.

Monumental Inscriptions frequently possess a value over and above even the Parish Registers, as great discrepancies often exist in regard to names and dates : for example, we find on the Monuments:—Murgutroyde, Pentin, and Pilbrow, whilst they are registered Morgatright, Fenton, and Pilborough.

These differences may in some instances be accounted for by imperfect information furnished by the friends of the deceased, mistakes on the part of the mason employed, and occasionally owing to the fact, that entries of Burials were not always made at the time of interment.

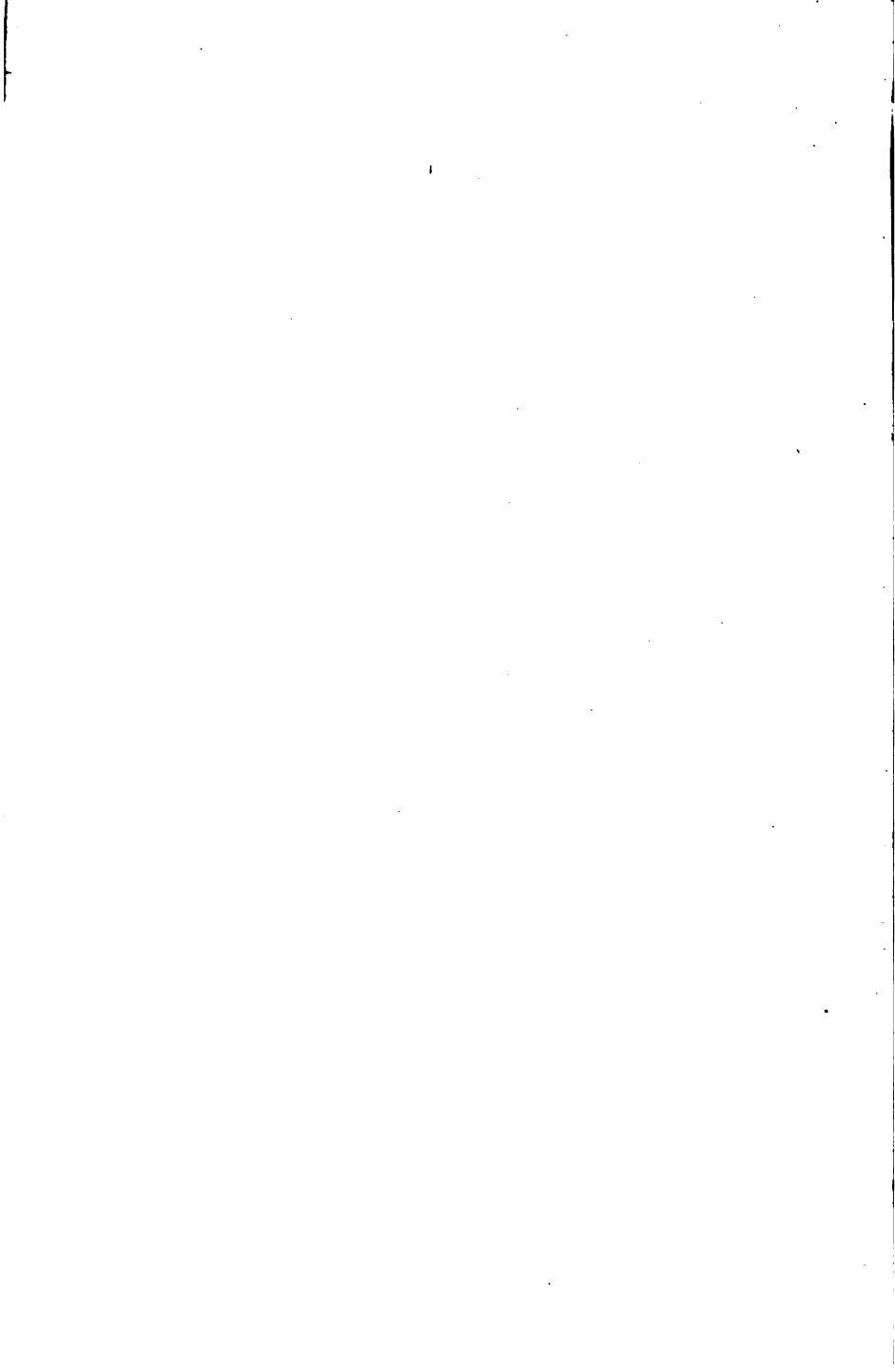
The 70th canon printed on an old form (page 5) preserved in the Church Chest, requires "upon every Sabbath Day the Minister shall write in the said Book the Names of all Persons christened, married, and buried."

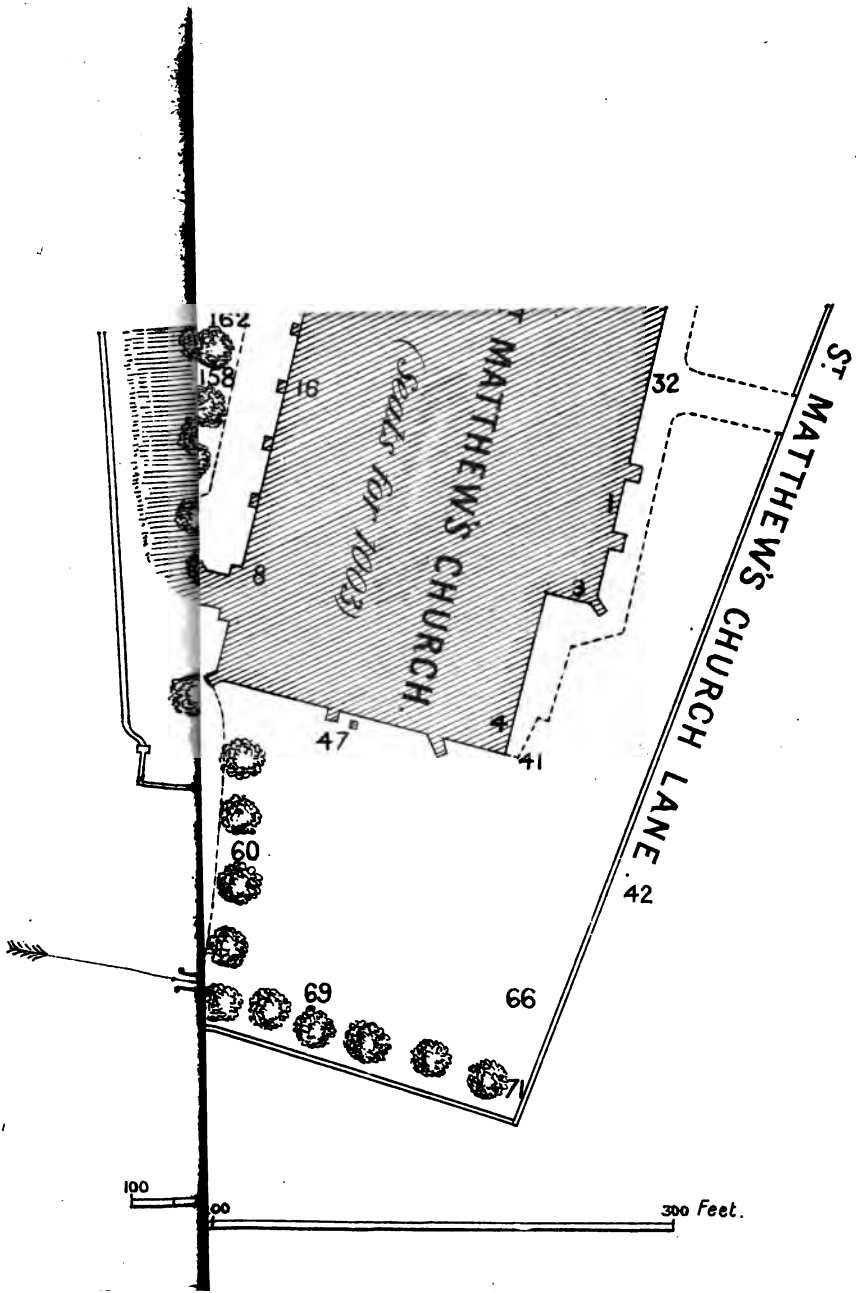
On page 7 "it is submitted to the Clergy whether it would not be right for them to be more attentive to their Register Books, to enter the Baptisms and Burials every week, or at least every time they perform Divine Service."

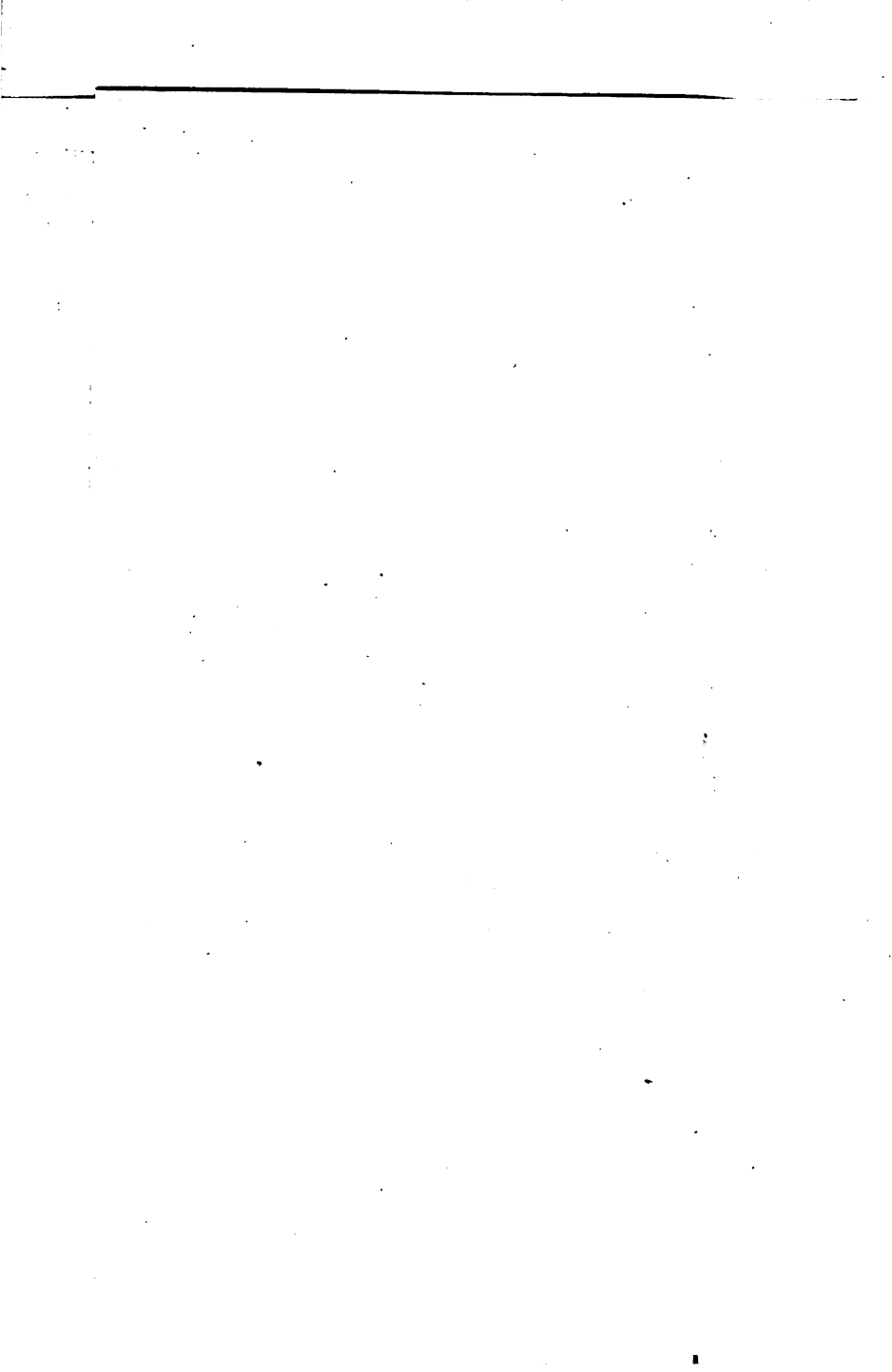
These observations account for the differences often existing between the Monuments and Registers, particularly in regard to date and age, and serve to explain apparent inaccuracies.
